

## ***Mount Royal Cemetery Sculpture Garden***

The "Sculpture Garden" created in 1992, is located in Mountain View, the summit of the Mount Royal Cemetery.

This area provides majestic views of the rolling hills which surround it as well as the urban landscape that expands eastward towards the St-Lawrence River.

The "Sculpture Garden" consists of two large sculptures, each created by a well-known Montreal artist that was commissioned by the Mount Royal Cemetery Company. They were designed to commemorate those people who have chosen to have their cremated remains buried in the surrounding area.

The first of the two sculptures is named "Hors du temps" and was created by Charles Daudelin. This sculpture is created of pink granite and contains 4 individual pieces forming a circle.

The second, named "Quadrata" was created by Marie France Brière. This sculpture is created of grey granite and contains 4 walls joined at the center forming an "X".

Each area or "room" in the Sculpture Garden, dedicated to the burial of cremated remains, consists of one Sculpture in the center, where the names & dates of those remembered can be engraved, and quadrants of land surrounding the sculpture where the burial of cremated remains can take place. This offers visitors the opportunity to wander through the corridors of these circular outdoor rooms while taking in the views of the city surrounding it and enjoying the variety of native shrubs that form the walls of each room as well as the branches of the towering oak trees that act as filters to the sun's rays.
